⁴ Washburn University offers study abroad scholarships for Washburn Law J.D. students studying abroad. Although we cannot guarantee a scholarship or a certain amount for any given year or student, those who timely apply (usually by approximately March 1 of each year), typically receive awards of \$500 or more.

⁵ Single-occupant, private room in a dormitory apartment with six total bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a central living area and kitchen.

⁶ Tends to vary by airline, route, and purchase date from approximately \$600 to \$1,000. Good planning can save money.

⁷ Course materials often are in the form of electronic materials that can be made available at low cost.

⁸ Students wishing to economize can save money by making breakfast and lunch at home and enjoying meals out a few times a week. Orientation will include introduction to a low-cost grocery in the area.

⁹ Bus transportation is inexpensive, frequent, and reliable, but taxi service is important for longer distances, nights, and weekends.
